bers, Cockey, Claude, Johnson and Brownley.

Mr. Johnson from the committee made a favorable report upon the bill for the relief of Ann Nicholls, of Queen Anne's county. The bill was then read a second and by special order, a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'elock.

Monday, February 13th, 1826.

The senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. Mr. Dickinson appeared in the senate. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution in favor of Charles Jones, was read a third

time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson presented the memorial of the president and directors of the Union Bank of Maryland, of the Mechanics Bank, and of the Commercial and Farmers Bank, praying to be partially released from the payment of the school tax; which was read and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Kent and Thomas.
