that Messrs. Johnson, Thomas and Dickinson, be a committee

to prepare and report the same.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of the children of William Traverse, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Worcester parish, in Worcester county, which was read the first time and

laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson from the committee to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of David Martin, of the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass with the following amendment, viz:—Strike out the words, 'The judges of Baltimore county court, or;' in the fourth and fifth lines of the first section;—which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.
