

The president laid before the senate the following letter from the president of the Washington and Baltimore Turnpike Road Company, which was read and with the accompanying account, referred to the house of delegates.

Gentlemen: I now have the honor to enclose you, for the information of the general assembly of the state of Maryland, an abstract of the accounts of the Washington and Baltimore Turnpike Road Company, in conformity to directions, in the act of assembly, passed at November session, 1812, entitled "An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the District of Columbia to the city of Baltimore."

The resolution in favor of the children of William Traverse, was read a second time, and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Orrell, and Brownley.

The resolution in favor of the clerk of Anne Arundel county court, was read the second, and by special order, the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee, to whom was referred the bill to appropriate a part of the school fund belonging to Frederick county, to the purposes therein mentioned, and for other purposes, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration and were of opinion that it ought to pass with the following amendment, viz: In the 4th line of the 3d section, insert after the word "county" the words "the said court taking good and sufficient security for the payment of the said fund and interest," which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read the second, and by special order, the third time, passed with the proposed amendments, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Scott asked, and obtained leave, to bring in a bill to be entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act, relating to the city of Baltimore, and it was ordered that Messrs. Scott, Johnson, and Bowie, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The further supplement to the act, entitled an act, to declare and enlarge the powers of the court of chancery and the county courts as courts of equity, was read the second time,
