Also, a bill entitled an act to authorise the sale of the real estate therein mentioned; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Scott, Miller and Bowie.

Also, a bill entitled an act to confirm a deed of conveyance therein mentioned; which was read the first time, and referred to

Messrs. Scott, Johnson and Tilghman.

Also, a bill entitled an act for changing part of the divisional line between Dorchester and Caroline counties; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs Orrell, Thomas and Dickinson.

Also a bill entitled an act to authorise the levy court of Frederick county, to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; which was read the first time and laid on the

table.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill to incorporate the Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland Steam Navigation company, with the amendments, heretofore proposed thereto; the same ing the order of the day. The bill and amendments having been read, the question was put, will the senate adopt the first amendment as proposed; being to strike out the word "fifteenth," for the purpose of inserting "twenty fifth," in the fifth line of the fourth section? Determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Bowie, the question was then put, will the senate strike out all that follows the words "and be it enacted," in the first line of the seventeenth section, to the word

"states" in the sixth line.
