and that such service shall be held good, valid and effectual, as a service of such process upon the said Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and that the said company shall annually report to the legislature of Pennsylvania, the progress they may make in constructing the said canal, and also an annual abstract of their accounts, certified by the oath of the president of the said company, shewing the amount of capital stock actually paid in, and the sums deposited with the treasurer for contingent and current expenses, and the profits which may have accrued, and the dividends made or declared during the preceeding year.
