The senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin Academy or school, in Baltimore county, with the amendment proposed to the same on yesterday. The same being read, the question was put, "will the senate assent to the amendment." The year and nays being required, appeared as follows:

Mr Scott was excused from serving on the said committee

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

Saturday, February 18th, 1826.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill concerning agents and factors was read a third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill for the relief of Horace Morris, of the state of New York; the bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Miller, from the committee to whom was re-committed the additional supplement to an act to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin academy, or school, in Baltimore county, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass with the following amendments, viz:

1st. In the 17th and 18th lines of the 1st section, strike out the words, "Philip Reister, Charles Larsh, Charles M'Elfresh, Henry Reister, and John Sumwalt, of said town, they," and insert the words, "the present trustees of Franklin academy the

said trustees."

2d. Strike out from the word "vicinity." in the 21st line of the 1st section, to the word "that," in the 23d line of the same section.
