P. S. The present distressed situation of my family, rendering it uncertain what day I shall be able to return to Washington, and feeling fearful the legislature might be about rising, must be my apology for writing from this place.

The bill to alter and change the name of Freeborn Coppage Dodson, a minor of Queen Anne's county, to Freeborn Coppage, was read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have had the amendments proposed by your honorable body, to a bill entitled an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin Academy, or school, in Baltimore county, under consideration, and have found it necessary to dissent therefrom; and, as we believe, the prosperity of the school will be assured by the passage of the bill in its original form, we must respectfully return the same, in the hope that you will recede from your proposed amendments.
