IN COUNCIL, Annapolis, February 22nd, 1826.

*Gentlemen of the Senate,*

*And of the House of Delegates,*

We transmit herewith resolutions passed by the general assembly of the State of Indiana, disapproving the amendments proposed by the State of Tennessee, to the constitution of the United States, in relation to the election of president and vice president of the United States, and also the amendment providing that no member of Congress shall be eligible to any office within the gift or nomination of the president of the United States, during the period for which he shall have been elected, and for six months thereafter, except appointments in the regular army or navy of the United States.

And reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, which was read the first, and by special order a second time and laid on the table.

Mr. Brownley made a favorable report upon the bill, empowering the levy courts of Baltimore and Harford counties, to build a bridge over the little gunpowder falls at Rockford; the bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
