

Mr. Johnson presented the petition of John Turner, and Samuel R. Turner, of Kent county, praying for an act to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners appointed by the court of Queen Anne's county, which was read and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Emory and Tilghman.

The resolution relative to the road from Washington to New Orleans, was read a third time, assented to, and returned

to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brownley asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at Havre de Grace. Ordered, that Messrs. Brownley, Miller and Kent, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Miller asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to incorporate the Susquehanna and Elkton Turnpike Company. Ordered, that Messrs. Miller, Emory and

Orrell, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Johnson from the committee reported a bill for the relief of Alexander Hemphill, of the city of Philadelphia, which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following

message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, February 27th, 1826.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

The session of the legislature is fast approaching to its close; we therefore propose with your concurrence, to appoint a joint committee of both houses, to examine the bills in each house, and report those that are necessary to be acted on before its adjournment. Messrs. Stevens, Merrick, Goldsborough, Hughes and Barnes, are nominated by this house, to join such gentlemen as may be appointed by you to report the result.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to provide a revenue for the support of the government of this state, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Johnson, Thomas, Kent

and Emory.

Mr. Brownley from the committee reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at Havre de Grace, which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill for the relief of sundry poor persons the several counties therein mentioned, was recommitted.
