

Mr. Miller from the committee reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Susquehanna and Elkton Turnpike Company, which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying an alteration of the laws relating to the public roads in said county, which was read and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Kent and Miller.

Mr. Tilghman offered the following message, which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, February 27th, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate have received your message proposing the appointment of a joint committee to examine the bills in each house and report those that are necessary to be acted on before its adjournment, and concur therewith. They have appointed Messrs. Tilghman and Kent, to join the gentlemen named by you for the above purpose. By order Wm. Kilty, clk.

Mr. Johnson from the committee reported a bill entitled, an act to regulate the manner of obtaining and altering public roads in Baltimore county, which was read the first and by special order, a second and third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee to whom was referred, the supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the establishment of state warehouses, for the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass with the following amendments; viz.

Amendments proposed—

1. Strike out from the word 'Baltimore' in the 5th line, first section down to the word 'to' in the 7th line of second section, and insert 'sufficiently large to contain ten thousand hogsheads with the necessary number of screws, scales and weights and offices for the safe keeping of the books, papers, accounts and other property of the warehouse; and the governor and council are further authorised. Strike out the words 'most convenient part of the' in the fourth lines, second section. After the word city in the fifth line insert 'of Baltimore, contiguous to navigable water and out of the thickly settled parts of the city.'

Add as an additional section.

2. And be it enacted, That the governor and council are further authorised, if they think proper, to require of the inspectors of tobacco, in the city of Baltimore, that they cause an accurate draft of the plan of a warehouse, to be immediately made out and laid before them, comprehending such arrangements for the inspection, safe keeping, reception and delivery of tobacco, the
