

The clerk of the house of delegates, delivered the engrossed bills from No 66 to No. 113 inclusive, which were read, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution relative to the sale of certain notes in the treasury, which was read the first time and laid on the table

Also, a resolution relative to the colonization society, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Bowie and Dickinson.

Also, a resolution in favor of George Page; which was read the first time, and by special order a second and third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs at law of Lawrence O'Neal, late of Montgomery county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Scott, Miller and Kent.

Also a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower the justices of the levy court of St. Mary's county, to fix and regulate the rates of public fines, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise Richard Lockwood of Cecil county, to remove two slaves from the state of Delaware, into the state of Maryland, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Bowie, Kent and Quinton.

Also, a bill entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to amend and reduce into one, the several acts of assembly relating to public roads in Worcester county, passed December session 1824, which was read the first, and by special order the second and third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the relief of the representatives of Walter Smith, late register of wills for calvert county, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act, entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Washington county, to levy a sum of money for the purpose of purchasing and providing a farm for the better and more economical support of the poor of Washington county, and for other purposes; which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Tilghman, Kent and Miller. And returned the bill to divorce Charles Warfield and Sarah his wife, of the city of Baltimore; "endorsed will pass."

Also, the supplement to the act entitled, an act for the improvement of M'Clure's dock, in the city of Baltimore, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments. Amendments proposed, viz—1st. In the first section, third line, strike out 'eight' and insert 'ten'—2d. In the fourth line strike out 'twenty' and insert 'twenty-two'—3d. In the second section, third line, strike out the word 'scows.' Which amendments were read and laid on the table.
