Mr. Brownley from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill to authorise the levy courts, of Baltimore and Harford counties, to build a bridge over the Little Falls of Gunpowder, at Lee's Mill, on the Belle Air road. The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson from the committee, made a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of James M. Crackin, of Harford county. The resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson from the committee, made a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of John Bond of Hampshire county, state of Virginia. The resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to regulate the charges on the inspection of tobacco in the state ware houses in the city of Baltimore. Ordered, that Messrs Bowie, Kent and Brownley, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Bowie from the committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill supplementary to an act to regulate lotteries, the bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill to provide a revenue for the support of the government of this state; the bill was then read a second and third time by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill for the establishment and support of public free schools in the first election district of Baltimore county: the bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of the administrator of Humphrey Barnes: which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.
