

Mr. Emory from the committee, made a favorable report upon the supplement to the act relating to a public landing and wharf, at the place commonly called the Ship yard, in Kent county, passed at December session, 1824, chapter 142; the bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates

Mr. Claude from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill for the relief of Elizabeth Hammond, the wife of Joshua Hammond, of Washington county, the bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates

Mr. Johnson asked, and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act relating to what gold and silver coin shall be a legal tender in this state. — Ordered, that Messrs Johnson, Miller and Kent, be a committee to prepare and report the same. Mr. Johnson reported the said bill, and it was read the first, and by special order a second and third time, passed, and sent to house of delegates.

Mr. Brownley from the committee made a favorable report upon the additional supplement to the act for the benefit of the stockholders in the Havre de Grace Bank: the bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kent delivered the following report; which was read.

The joint committee appointed by the senate and of the house of delegates, to examine the bills in each house, and report those that are necessary to be acted on before the adjournment of the legislature, report, that it is necessary that the senate should act upon all the unconsidered bills now lying upon your table.

The gentlemen appointed in joint committee by the house of delegates, will make a special report to that honorable body on the subject of the bills now lying upon the table of, and not yet acted on by the house of delegates.

Which is respectfully submitted.

The resolution in favor of John Barnes, clerk of Charles county court, was read the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favor of Thomas Pollard's securities, was read a second and third time, amended, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Amendment proposed—

At the end of the resolution insert the following: 'provided, that it shall and may be lawful to issue an execution or executions on said judgments, at any time within one year from the first day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty seven, or to proceed upon such execution or executions, as may have been issued at the date of this resolution.'
