

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act relating to the road lately located from Sharpsburg to Hagers town, in Washington county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Johnson, Bowie and Scott.

Also a bill entitled an act for the benefit of William Cord, of Cecil county, and others; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Miller, Kent and Emory.

Also a bill entitled, an act to establish free schools in Prince Georges' county; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Bowie, Johnson and Miller.

Also a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising commissioners to purchase a fire engine, for the use of the inhabitants of Williams' Port, in Washington county; which was read the first time, and laid on the table.

Also a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the extension of Lombard street, in the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Johnson, Kent and Scott.

Also a bill entitled, an act authorising and requiring the erection of indexes or finger boards, in the several counties therein mentioned; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Tilghman, Emory and Dickinson.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to confirm and make valid the acts of Joseph Bryan, a justice of the peace of Cecil county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Miller, Kent and Dickinson.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Susanna G. Edmonson, of Baltimore county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Cockey, Johnson, Claude and Brownley.

Mr. Miller from the committee to whom was referred the bill to confirm the acts of Joseph Bryan, a justice of the peace, of Cecil county, reported that the committee were of opinion, that it ought to pass with the following amendment, viz—

At the end of the bill, add 'as if the said Joseph Bryan, had duly qualified'—which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second and third time by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson made a favorable report upon the supplement to the act for the extension of Lombard street, in the city of Baltimore. The bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, amended, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Amendment proposed—

Add at the end of the bill—'Provided, That this act shall have no effect, unless approved of by the mayor and city council of Baltimore.'

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
