Also, a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the beirs of John C. Ireland, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs Kent, Di kinson and Miller.

Mr. Brownley offered the following message which was

Determined in the negative.

And be it enacted, That after the sum of \$70,000 including the sum of \$31,404 22 already raised shall have been raised by virtue of this act, and its several supplements to which this is a further supplement, the rivilege conferred by the said act and its several supplements, is hereby repealed.
