3d. Strike out the first section after the enacting clause and insert 'that from and after the first day of May next, it shall not be lawful to institute more than one suit on a joint and several bond penal or single bill, when the persons executing the same are alive and reside in the same county, and that if more than one part be instituted, or any such bond, penal or single bill, judgment of more proofs shall be entered against the referee or referees in such suits.'
