Mr. Johnson from the committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to compensate the sheriff of Baltimore county, for certain services; which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to create a board of public works, was read a third time. On motion, the question was put, will the senate amend the bill, by inserting after the word 'directors,' in the third line of the first section, the words 'who shall be appointed by the governor and council.' Determined in the negative.

The question was then put—shall the bill pass?

Monday, March 6th, 1826.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The resolution in favor of Beachamp Ackemth, was read a second and by special order, a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to reduce the charges on cooperage, inspection, outage, portage and dealing in state warehouses, for the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore was read a second and by special order, a third time, and the question was put, shall the bill pass?

The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows:
