

Also a resolution relative to the western limits of this state, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also a resolution relative to revisiting the penitentiary; which was read the first time, and laid on the table.

Also a resolution in favor of Samuel White, and a resolution in favor of William Deavor; which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Orrell, Miller and Dickinson.

Also a resolution relative to the printing of the laws; which was read the first time and laid on the table.

And returned the bill to incorporate the Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland steam navigation company, endorsed "amendments reported by the joint committee assented to," which was laid on the table.

Mr. Claule from the committee, reported favorable upon the bill to divorce David H. White and Ann White, of the city of Baltimore. The bill was then laid on the table.

The bill concerning mortgages and other deeds, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion the senate reconsidered the bill to authorize the keeping of gates on the public road therein mentioned in Montgomery county. The same being read, was rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion the bill to repeal certain acts of assembly relative to amerciaments, and to lay a tax on plaintiffs, who may institute actions at law, in the several county courts of this state, was referred to Messrs. Bowie, Johnson, Thomas, Kent and Emory.

Mr. Emory reported a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act for the benefit of Ann Rochester and Francis Rochester; which was read the first, and by special order a second and third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill relating to the road lately located from Sharpsburg to Hagers Town, in Washington county. The bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill relative to appeal writ of error and injunction bonds, with the amendments heretofore proposed thereto, was read a third time, and the question was put, "will the senate assent to the amendment?" Determined in the affirmative.

The bill was then passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to protect the breed of fish in the rivers and waters, of Anne Arundel county, was read a third time passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill to authorize the levy court of Frederick county,
