The resolution in favor of the collector of Talbot county, was read a second and by special order a third time, assented to.

The resolution relative to the revision of the laws, was read a second time. On motion the question was put, will the senate receive the following as an amendment, viz.

After the words 'states' in the fifteenth line, insert 'specifying the said acts or parts of acts so omitted.' Determined in

the affirmative.

The amendments proposed by the house of delegates, to the bill supplementary to the act for founding a university in the products of the city of Baltimore, to be called the university of Maryland, were read and asserted to.

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the bill for the relief of Alexander Hemphill, of the city of Philadelphia, en-

dorsed will not pass."
