

2nd. Before the words 'in Prince George's county,' insert the following, 'for Eleanor Gibson, twenty dollars.'

3d. Strike out 'thirty,' and insert 'twenty dollars,' as the sum beyond which the levy court of Prince George's county is not authorised to assess and levy for the respective persons therein named.'

4th. Immediately preceeding the words 'in Cecil county,' insert 'and for Anna Gray, twenty dollars.'

5th. Strike out 'thirty,' and insert 'twenty dollars,' as the sum beyond which the levy court of Queen Ann's county, shall not be authorised to assess and levy for the respective persons therein named.

6th. Strike out the name of John Iams, and the sum attached thereto, in the fourth line of the third page, and insert in lieu thereof, 'for the two orphan children under the care of John Iams, thirty dollars, for Lucy Harris thirty dollars, for Henry Ayler twenty dollars.'

7th. In the case of Mary Hill, of Worcester county, strike out 'thirty' and in lieu thereof insert 'twenty.'

8th. In relation to Harford county,—strike out the name of 'William Sloan,' and the sum thereto annexed.

9th. In regard to Montgomery county, strike out 'Hetty Shaw,' and insert in lieu thereof 'Kitty Shaw.'

Which amendments were read and assented to.

Also the bill to authorise the appointment of justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, with limited jurisdiction, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments.' Amendments proposed, viz.

1st. Strike out from the third line of the enacting clause, the words 'such and so many,' and insert in lieu thereof the word 'four.'

2nd. Strike out from the sixth line of said clause the words 'as shall be deemed expedient.'

Which amendments were read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Scott presented the petition of Ramsay Waters, register in chancery; which was read.

Mr. Bowie offered the following resolution, which was read the first time, and laid on the table.
