with the commissioners proposed to be appointed on the part of this state, and for the appointment of an umpire by the governor of the State of Delaware in case of disagreement as aforesaid: And shall also pledge the faith of the said state, that the said compact, agreement or umpirage as the case may be, shall be conclusive on the said state, and also, that all rights derived under this state to lands lying within any of the disputed territory, which shall be adjudged to belong to Virginia, shall be respected.

Resolved, That the said commissioners and the said umpire shall from time to time make reports of all proceedings had under and in virtue of those resolutions to the executive of this state.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to transmit a copy of those resolutions to his excellency the governor of Virginia, to be laid before the legislature of the said commonwealth.

• Determined in the affirmative, and the resolution as amended, was assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie, from the committee to whom was referred the bill to repeal certain acts of assembly relating to amerancements, and to lay a tax upon plaintiffs who shall institute actions at law in the several county courts of this state, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass. The bill was then read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
