

Determined in the negative, and it was returned to the house of delegates.

Also a bill entitled an act, to regulate the gauging of casks, and the inspection of domestic distilled liquors in the city of Baltimore, which was read the first, and by special order, a second time, and laid on the table, also a bill entitled an act to establish district courts, for the trial of assault and battery, and for other purposes, which was read the first time, and laid on the table.

Mr. Bowie offered the following message which was read.

By the Senate, March 7th, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have rejected and return you the bill entitled "an act to pay the civil list, and other expenses of civil government," because it increases the salaries of the auditor and the examiner generals, the first \$100 the other \$200 when the senate are not advised of any increase of the duties of these officers.

On motion the question was put, "will the senate amend the message by adding the following, "and because we conceive the salary of the messenger of the council, not to be an adequate compensation for his services." Determined in the affirmative, the message was then assented to as amended, and sent to the house of delegates.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Wednesday, March 8th, 1826.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of county clerks; which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of William Caton, which was read the first time and laid on the table.

Also a resolution in favor of Colonel Joseph Isaac; which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution relative to the school fund in Anne Arundel county; which was read the first, and by special order, a second and third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

And returned the resolution in favor of the register in chancery, and chancery papers, endorsed 'assented to.'
