regulate the gauging of casks and the inspection of domestic distilled liquors in the city of Baltimore, and as we believe that the interests of agriculture and commerce require the passage of that act, and as we are also of opinion that our obligation to maintain and respect the constitution of the United States, demands an interference on our part within the city of Baltimore, on this subject; we most respectfully request that you will reconsider and adopt that bill.
