

## OF THE SENATE.

The senate also reconsidered the bill authorising the governor and council to appoint inspectors of salted fish for the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes; the same being read, the question was put, will the senate receive the following as an amendment.

Add as an additional section—

And be it enacted, That the said inspectors shall not be allowed to brand any barrels of herrings put up at any of the fisheries on the Chesapeake Bay, unless said barrels shall have the name of the owner or of the firm, as the case may be, first branded upon the barrel.

Determined in the negative.

The bill was then rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to the revision of the laws, was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Thursday, March 9th, 1826.

The senate met. Present, the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Johnson from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims made a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of James Leonard. The resolution was then read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Scott offered the following the message which was read, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

By the Senate, March 9th, 1826.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

The senate having disposed of nearly all the business before them, propose with the concurrence of your house, to invite his excellency the governor to attend in the senate chamber, at 12 o'clock, to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and close the session this day. Should those propositions receive your assent, the senate have appointed Messrs. Scott and Kent, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honorable body to wait upon his excellency.
