
## OF THE SENATE.



The senate adjourned until 4 o'clock, P. M.

The senate met. Present the same members as in the

morning,

Mr. Miller from the committee, made a favorable report apon the resolution in favor of Benjamin West of the city of Baltimore; the resolution in favor of Samuel Davis of Baltimore county; the resolution in favor of John Truck; the resolution in favor of Daniel Auld, of Talbot county, and the resolution in favor of Benjamin Marshall; which were severally read the second and third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The further supplement to the act relating to lotteries, was read a second and third time by special order, amended, passed

and returned to the house of delegates.

Amendment proposed, viz.

Strike out all of the bill that follows the first section.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the ninth election district in Baltimore county; which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of Jonas Green; which was read,

assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of William O'Hara, late sheriff of Anne Arundel county and his securities; which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of John Clare, late sheriff of Calvert county; which was read, assented to, and returned to the

house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of Anna Baker and others; which was read assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a bill entitled an act to make valid the acts of justices of the peace, relating to supersedeases; which was read the first. and by special order, a second and third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a bill entitled an act to oblige the owners or occupiers of mills or other water works, to keep bridges over their races, in the several counties of this state; which was read, passed.

and returned to the house of delegates.

And returned the bill relating to Baltimore county court, endorsed 'will not pass.'
