

The clerk of the house of delegates returned the said bills, endorsed, 'read and assented to.'

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill to divorce Nicholas Hitzelberger, and Amelia, his wife; which was read the first, and by special order a second and third time, and returned to the house of delegates.

And returned the resolution in favor of the visitors and governors of St. John's college, endorsed, 'assented to, with the proposed amendment,' which amendment was read and assented to.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the journal of accounts, with a bill to pay the journal of accounts, which was three times read, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also a resolution in favor of Gideon Pearce and Benson Coe; which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also the engrossed bills No. 207, to 216, inclusive, and from No. 221, to 228, inclusive; which were read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

His excellency the governor, having appeared in the senate chamber, it was ordered, that Messrs Scott and Emory wait upon the speaker and members of the house of delegates, and inform them that his excellency is now attending in the senate chamber, ready to sign and seal the laws, and request their attendance to witness the same.

The speaker attended by the members of the house of delegates, appeared in the senate chamber, when the engrossed bills from number 161 to number 228, inclusive, were presented by the speaker to his excellency the governor, who signed and sealed the same, in the presence of both houses.

The speaker and members of the house of delegates having withdrawn from the senate chamber, the senate adjourned until the first Monday in September next.
