

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, December 28th, 1826  
Gentlemen of the Senate,

We assent with pleasure to an interchange of services between the Reverend Chaplains of the two houses.

On motion by Mr. Spencer, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act to change the christian name of Thomas Littleton Robins, the infant son of James B. Robins, late of Worcester county, deceased.—Ordered, that Messrs. Spencer, Dennis and Whitely, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

On motion, by Mr. Harrison, leave was given to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to repeal certain acts of assembly, relative to amerciaments and to lay a tax on plaintiffs who may institute actions at law in the several county courts of this state. Ordered, that Messrs. Harrison, Nelson, and Sewell be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Spence from the committee reported a bill, entitled “an act to change the christian name of Thomas Littleton Robins, the infant son of James B. Robins, late of Worcester county, deceased—which was read the first time and laid on the table.

The message relative to the printing for the present session proposed on yesterday, by Mr. Thomas, was read a second time.

On motion, by Mr. Forrest, the question was put “will the senate strike out the following words “and concur therewith. The senate have appointed Messrs. \_\_\_\_\_ to join the committee appointed by your body,” for the purpose of inserting the following, viz. “and concur in the object thereof, but have appointed a committee of an equal number with that appointed on the part of your house, consisting of Messrs. \_\_\_\_\_ Determined in the affirmative.

The blank was then on motion filled up with the names of Messrs. Thomas, Forrest, Nelson, Dennis, and Rees, to constitute the said committee. The message was then assented to, as amended, and sent to the house of delegates.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.

Friday, December 29th, 1826.
