The bill entitled, an act to alter the time of holding the county courts of Frederick county, and for other purposes, was read the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to change the name of John Calender and Ann his wife, and Mary Ann his daughter, to that of Williams, and for other purposes, was read the second time,

and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to alter and change the name of James Mills of Dorchester county, to the name of James Applegarth, was read the second time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to alter the time for the transaction of equity business in the county courts of the first judicial district, was read the second time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Mary Hall, of Worcester county, was read the first time, and referred to the

committee on out pensioners.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal an act, requiring the judges of the fourth judicial district of the state to set apart certain days or the transaction of equity business, in said courts, so far as the same has reference to Dorchester county, was read the second time, and referred to messrs. Spence, Dennis and Whitely.

The bill entitled, an act for the making the several turnpike roads, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks therein mentioned; was read the second time, and

ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act to revive and extend the provisions of an act entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation of Snow-Hill, in Worcester county, and for other purposes, was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
