

Mr. Sewell, from the committee to whom was referred the bill to divorce Catharine Will, and her husband George Will, of Fredeirick county, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass; the bill was then read a second time.

On motion by Mr. Nelson, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to suspend the act entitled "an act taxing, or licensing certain dealers in lottery tickets, and others, and it was ordered, that Messrs. Nelson, Johnson, and Heath, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

Mr. Marriot, from the committee to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act to establish the jurisdiction of justices of the peace and constables residing in the city of Annapolis, and justices of the peace and constables of Anne Arundel county, in certain cases therein mentioned, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion, that it ought to pass with the following amendments, viz.—1st, In the 5th line, strike out the words "and properly."—2d, In the 11th line, strike out the words "or property,"—3d, In the 13th line, strike out the words "feri facias."—4th, In the 17th, line, strike out the words "or property."—5th, In the 19th line, strike out the words "feri facias." Which amendments were read and assented to. The bill was then read a second time as amended, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, and having been engrossed, was read a third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion, ordered, that the further supplement to the act entitled, an act for enlarging the powers of the high court of chancery, be printed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the governor and council of Maryland, to appoint the inspectors of flour for this state. A bill entitled, an act to repeal an act relating to the public roads in Talbot county, passed at December session, 1825, and a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the re-valuation of real and personal property in Alleghany county, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty four, which were severally read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to authorise the erection of gates on the public roads therein mentioned, in Dorchester county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Spence, Herbert and Whitely.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act against excessive usury, the same being the order of the day.

On motion, the question was put, will the senate receive the following as amendments to the said bills.
