The bill for the re-valuation of the real and personal proper-

ty in Cecil county, was read a second time.

On motion, the bill for the benefit of John Aisquith, the administrator of Robert Aisquith, late of the city of Baltimore, deceased, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to enlarge the powers of the trustees of the poor for Montgomery county, and for other purposes, was read a second

time.

he bill for the relief of negro Esther, and others her descendants, was read a second time, and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.

The resolution, authorising the bridge over the upper part of the Beaver Dam Run, where it crosses the public road in Prince Georges county, to be kept in repair at the expense of said county, was read a second and by special order, a third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

The supplement to an act entitled, an act to alter and amend the charter of the city of Annapolis, was read a second time

and referred to messrs. Marriott, Thomas and Herbert.

The bill to authorise and empower James J. Bourne, of Calvert county, to perfect a contract entered into by himself, and Susan his wife, with Nathaniel Dare of the said county, and for other purposes, was read a second time, and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.

Mr. Dennis delivered the following report, which was read

and concurred with.

The comittee on ivalid deeds, to whom was referred the bill entitled, and act authorising the recording of a deed from Henry Howard, of John, to Andrew Anderson, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to report, that they are of opinion that the said bill ought to be rejected, and that it is inexpedient to legislate speedily, in favour of the grantee, named in said bill, because our existing laws afford a mode of relief suitable to, and sufficient for the exigency of his case.

The bill authorising the recording of a deed from Henry Howard, of John, to Andrew Anderson, was then read a second and by special order, a third time, rejected, and returned to

the house of delegates.

On motion, the resolution in favour of William Caton, of

the city of Annapolis, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, an act extending the time for Fielder Cross, collector of Prince George's county, to complete his collections, was read a second time, and ordered to lie on the table.
