On motion by Mr. Johnson, leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to aid conveyances of land improperly enrolled, and for other purposes. Ordered, that Messrs. Johnson, Herbert and Marri-

ott, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The resolution in favour of Benjamin Tomlinson, a member of the late electoral college, reimbursing him for extraordinary expenses incurred in consequence of sickness, whilst engaged in the discharge of his duties as such, was read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to provide for the preservation of the records belonging to the office of the clerk of Somerset county, was read a second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent

to the house of delegates.

The supplement to the act entitled, an act to authorise the governor and council of Maryland to appoint the inspectors of flour for this state, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising the commissioners to lay out a road in Montgomery and Anne Arundel counties, was read the second and by special order, the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to authorise the levy court of Washington county to levy a sum of money to be applied towards the erection of a bridge over the Conococheague creek, on the road leading from

Hagerstown to Mercersburg, was read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the administration of justice in the case of crimes and misdemeanor, in the city and precincts of Baltimore which was read the

On motion by Mr. Johnson leave was given to bring in a bill to be entitled an act to change the time of electing representatives of this state in the Congress of the United States .-Ordered, that messrs. Johnson, Forrest and Spence, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

The bill entitled a further supplement to an act entitled, an act for enlarging the power of the high court of chancery was read a third time, and the question was put, shall the bill pass!
