from said bill; if the grantee, or those claiming under him, have been in possession of the property conveyed, and so continue long enough to be availed by the statute of limitations, no further relief will be requisite. If the amount of property in question is too small to induce the grantee to seek relief by a suit in equity, it will probably be too small to induce an adverse claimant to disturb his possession by suit at law.
