

and property shall be so received; and if the said pauper shall leave the poor house, with the consent of the trustees thereof, such part of the said property as shall remain unapplied to the use aforesaid, shall be restored to him." Which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution, extending the time for commissioners, trustees and other authorities, of the several literary institutions in this state, to make report, which was read the first time.

Also, a resolution in relation to a polar expedition, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill for the relief of Henrietta S. Love, of the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on divorces.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to alter and change the location of Hall's Cross Roads and Belle Air election districts, in Harford county, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill to extend the time for James Derickson, late collector of Worcester county, to complete his collections, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend so much of an act entitled, an act to lay out and open a road from Westminster, in Frederick county, to the city of Washington and Georgetown, as relates to the opening of said road, through Montgomery county, which was read the first and by special order, a second and third time, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to provide for the repairing a certain bridge therein mentioned, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relate to the time and manner of electing the senate, and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, so that each county, and the city of Baltimore, may have a senator, to be elected immediately by the people, which was read the first time.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Herbert and Mr. Sewell appeared in the senate.

On motion, the supplement to the act to aid conveyances of land improperly enrolled, and for other purposes, the bill to
