

of, and insert "as the said James and Susan his wife, if she were now living, could by a conveyance, by them executed, acknowledged, and recorded according to law."—3d, Between the 3d and 4th sections of the bill, as sent from the house of delegates, insert the following as an additional section.—"And be it enacted, that it shall and may be lawful, for the orphan's court of Calvert county, and they are hereby required to ascertain and determine, what portion of the purchase money, for which said land was, as above contracted, to be sold by the said James and the said Susan his wife, to the said Nathaniel G. Dare, the said James J. Bourne is entitled to be allowed for his life estate in said land, as tenant by the curtesy, not allowing more than a third, nor less than a seventh, and also, what portion of the balance of said purchase money each of the children of the said James and the said Susan his wife, are respectively entitled, for their distributive share thereof."—4th, Insert after the word "thereon," in the 7th line of the 5th section, the following words, "from the death of the said Susan their mother."—5th, Strike out the 9th section of the said bill. 6th, Strike out of the 8th section, the words "toties quoties," Which amendments were read and assented to. The bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Forrest from the committee, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to injunctions, which was read the first time, and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Herbert, from the committee to whom was referred, the bill to prevent boats and other vessels from taking sand from that part of the eastern branch of the Potomac, lying and being in Prince George's county, reported, that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass, with the following amendment, viz:—Add the following, at the end of the bill, "Provided always, that if the owner or owners, of any boat or boats, seized under this law, shall within ten days after such seizure, enter into bond, under a penalty of one hundred dollars, with security to be approved by the justices of the peace, under whose warrant such boat or boats shall have been seized, conditioned to prosecute with effect, an appeal to the next county court which shall be thereafter, then the said boat or boats shall be restored to such owner or owners."—"And be it enacted, that it shall be the duty of the judges of Prince George's county court, at their next term of said court, after such bond is executed, to hear and determine the said appeal, and give judgement thereon, as they do upon appeals from the judgements of justices of the peace."—Which amendment was read and assented to. The bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Spence, from the committee to whom was referred, the bill extending the time for James Derickson, late collector of Worcester county, to complete his collections reported the same with the following amendments, viz. 1st, Strike out the word
