

Friday, February 2d, 1827.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution extending the time for commissioners, trustees, and other authorities, of the several literary institutions in this state, to make report, was read a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill to continue in force, the several acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to establish a library for the use of the legislature, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill for the relief of Michael De Young, of the city of Baltimore, was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Johnson, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to establish a mutual beneficial society in the city of Baltimore, by the name of St. Patrick's Society.

The said bill was then read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The president laid before the senate the following communication, which was read, and with the enclosed statement, ordered to be printed, and referred to the committee on lotteries.
