

Goldsborough, of Baltimore county, was, with the said bill recommitted.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee to whom the said report and bill was recommitted, reported the said bill, with the following amendment, viz: "Provided nevertheless, that this act shall have no force and effect whatever, until the said Howse Goldsborough, shall enter into bond, to the state of Maryland, with security, to be approved by the orphan's court of Dorchester county, in the penalty of six thousand dollars, and there to be deposited for safe keeping, conditioned for the payment to whomsoever may be thereunto entitled, of the value of the lands herein before mentioned, in case the said Mary Ward, should not make an appointment by last will and testament, pursuant to the deed from Henry Ennalls to George Ward, and the said Mary Ward, giving the said power of appointment, which bond shall be recorded by the register of wills of said county, and a copy thereof certified under the seal of said court, shall be good evidence to prove the execution of such bond, in any court of this state.—Which amendment was read, and assented to.—The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The president pro. tem. laid before the senate the following communication, which was read, and with the enclosed report, was referred to the committee on ways and means.
