The president pro. tem. named Messrs Heath, and Forrest, to constitute the said committee on the part of the senate.

Mr. Heath asked to be excused from serving on the said committee, on the ground of the unavoidable necessity of his colleague (Mr. Johnson's) leaving the seat of government, in a short time, on important and urgent business of the state, and he was accordingly excused, and Mr. Herbert substituted in his place.

The message was then assented to, and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill relating to the proceedings of the levy court of Baltimore county, was referred to Messrs. Johnson, Heath, and Thomas.

Mr. Heath asked to be excused from serving on the said committee, on the ground of his having been formerly counsel in the case to which the bill relates, and he was accordingly excused, and Mr. Forrest substituted in his place.

Mr. Heath, from the committee to whom was referred, the bill relative to the establishment of a light house on Point Concord, at the mouth of the Susquehannah river, with the amendments heretofore made to the same by the senate, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass, with the following additional amendment, to wit:—add the following proviso to the 2d section. "Provided that the three lots on Concord Point, now owned and used as a fishery by Joshua Green and Alexander Myers, shall not be subject to condemnation for a garden."—Which amendment was read, and after some discussion, with the bill, ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to regulate and restrain the sale of lottery tickets, was read a third time.

On motion, the question was put, "will the senate receive the following as an amendment?" viz:—In the 4th line of the 3d section, strike out "five hundred," and insert, "eight hundred."—Determined in the negative.
