

Mr. Heath, from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of lumber.—The bill was then read a second time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendment proposed, add as an additional section to the bill, "And be it enacted that the said Sophia Porter, shall be and she is hereby declared to be entitled to the care, custody and guardianship of any and every child or children of the said marriage, without the controul in any manner of the said Lewis Porter.

Mr. Heath from the committee reported a bill, relating to mortgages, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr Heath asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled an act to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned.—Ordered that Messrs. Heath, Forrest and Dennis be a committee to prepare and report the same.
