

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate Baltimore second dispensary, "was read a third time, and passed.

Mr. Johnson, asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act respecting the right of a widow, to such slaves as are manumitted by the will of her husband."—Ordered that Messrs. Johnson, Dennis and Forrest be a committee to prepare and report the same.

On motion, the bill to repeal part of an act entitled, an act to appropriate certian lands to the use of the officers and soldiers of this state, and for the sale of vacant lands passed at November session 1781, was referred to Messrs. Forrest, Kennedy and Harrison.

Mr. Heath, from the committee reported a bill, entitled, an act relating to bail in civil actions, which was read the first time, and ordered to be printed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Friday, February 16th, 1827.

The proceedings from Friday last to yesterday, inclusive, were read.

Mr. Marriott, from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the resolution in favour of William Caton, of the
