

By the Senate, February 20th, 1827.

On motion, the bill relating to mortgages, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill for the relief of Rachel Russel, of Prince Georg's county was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sewell from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the bill to divorce Jane Atkinson, and her husband Hugh Atkinson, of the city of Baltimore. The said bill was then read a second time.

On motion, the bill relating to bail in civil actions, was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the bill to divorce Rebecca Thrush, and her husband Nicholas Thrush of the city of Baltimore, and the bill for draning the right prong of a branch in Queen Ann's county, known by the name of the Andover branch, were laid on the table.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Wednesday, 21st February, 1827.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Sewell, from the committee on divorces, made a favourable report upon the bill for the relief of John Teamans, of Cecil county.—The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to incorporate the Cumberland engine company, in the town of Cumberland, in Alleghany county.—The said bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sewell, from the committee on divorces, made an unfavourable report upon the bill for the relief of David Green, of the city of Baltimore.—The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and unanimously rejected.

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee to whom was referred the supplement to a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for the more effectual collection of the county charges of Alleghany county, reported the same with the following amendments, viz:—1st, In the title of the bill, strike out the
