The resolution authorising the sale of sundry articles of furniture and other property, in and about the state and government house belonging to the state, was read the second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of John S. Maffitt of Cecil county, was read a second time.

The supplement to an act entitled, an act for the valuation of real and personal property in the several counties of this state, passed at November session, 1812, chapter 191, so far as it relates to Dorchester county, was read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill to provide for the payment of the bailiffs of Prince George's county, was referred to Messrs. Herbert, Marriott, and Nelson.

The bill to authorise and empower commissioners to open and extend the breadth of an alley in Westminster in Frederick county, was read a second time.

The supplement to an act, entitled, an act for changing the name of Charles-town, in Charles County, to that of Port Tobacco, for securing the titles of proprietors of lots and houses therein, and for the regulation and improvement of the said town, was read a second time.

On motion the act to regulate and organize the militia of this state was referred to Messrs. Herbert, Thomas, Heath, Sewell and Whitely.

On motion, the bill to divorce Jane Atkinson, and her husband Hugh Atkinson, of the city of Baltimore, was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion the bill regulating writs of error and granting appeals to the court of appeals, was ordered to lie on the table.
