On motion, the bill relating to habitual drunkards, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act, for enlarging the power of the high court of chancery, was read a second time, amended, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Amendments to the said bill proposed and assented to.

1st. Strike out the words 'to the city or county court of Baltimore,' in the 2d and 3d lines of the 1st section.

2d. After the word 'chancery,' in the 4th line of the same section, insert the words, 'or county courts, setting as courts of equity.'

3d. Strike out the following words in the 5th line of the same section, viz. 'residing in the said city or county.'

4th. After the word 'court,' in the 6th line of the same section, insert the words 'or courts or any judge thereof.'

5th. After the word 'court,' in the 3d line of the 2d section, insert the words 'or courts.'

6th. Strike out the following words in the same line, 'to the city or county of Baltimore.'

7th. After the word 'chancellor,' in the 5th line of the same section, insert the words 'or said courts or any judge thereof.'

8th. After the word 'chancellor,' in the 3d line of the 3d section, insert the words 'or said courts or any judge thereof.'

Mr. Heath, asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the better regulation of apprentices.—Ordered that Messrs. Heath, Marriott and Herbert, be a committee to prepare and report the same.

On motion, the bill to regulate the bounds of prisons in this state, was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein mentioned, was read a second, and by special order a third time, amended, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.—Amendment proposed.—After the word 'crows,' in the 4th line, insert the words 'killed, after the passage of this act.'

Mr. Kennedy, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to authorise the governor and council of Maryland, to appoint one justice of the levy court for each election district of Washington county.—The said bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the better regulation of apprentices, which was read the first time, and ordered to be printed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock
