

The senate resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio Rail road company, the motion before the senate being to make the said bill the order of the day for Friday next.—The said motion having been withdrawn, the senate proceeded to give the said bill a second reading by special order.

On motion, the following was offered as an amendment and assented to, viz.—After the word “mixed” in the 11th line of the 2nd section, insert “so far as shall be necessary for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, and no further.”

The bill was then read a third time, by special order passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Herbert from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill making appropriation for the benefit of the American Colonization Society, the said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Forrest from the committee, reported favourably to prevent the going at large of swine in Rockville in Montgomery county, the said bill was then read a second and third time, by special order and passed.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Thursday, 1st March, 1827.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Thomas. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to prevent the going at large of swine in Rockville, in Montgomery county, and the bill for the improvement of the town of Rockville, in Montgomery county, were returned to the house of delegates.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill relating to lunatic and insane persons.—The said bill was then read a second time, and the following amendments proposed and assented to, viz:—1st, After the word ‘act,’ in the 11th line of the 1st section, insert the following, viz: ‘or to a hospital
