

credited for, and allowed, in settling the account of the said Robert C. Aisquith as collector aforesaid, for taxes owing from insolvent persons or others, which the said Robert C. Aisquith did not and could not collect in his life time."

3d. In the 2nd section, 3d line, after the word "as" insert "the said commissioners of the tax shall have ascertained that."

4th. In the 5th line, same section, after the word 'same' insert "in other cause."

5th. At the end of the 2nd section, add the following, viz. 'and the said levy court shall levy such sum as shall be necessary for that purpose in the assessable property within the city of Baltimore.'

The bill to exempt the Baltimore Athænum from taxation, was read a second time, and amended. Amendment proposed viz.

After the word 'assessment' in the 6th line, strike out the words 'so long as' and insert in lieu thereof, the words 'for the term of five years provided.'

The bill so amended, was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, the bill to provide for the building of a bridge over the Patapsco Falls, at or near the Thistle Factory, was recommitted, and the committee enlarged by the addition to it of Messrs. Sewell and Dennis.

The bill for the relief of certain negroes therein mentioned was read the second time.

Mr. Dennis, made a favourable report upon the bill entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to the keepers of ordinaries and retailers of spirituous liquors. The bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Dennis, made an unfavourable report upon the bill to confirm and make valid two deeds of manumission therein mentioned. The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland Chymical Works, which was read the first, and by special order a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The supplement to the act entitled, an act for regulating the mode of staying executions, and for repealing the acts, of assembly therein mentioned, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Whiteley, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to authorise the levy court of Caroline
