The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de Grace, endorsed, will pass.

Mr. Dennis, made an unfavourable report upon the resolution suspending all proceedings on a judgment obtained against Roger Harper, late of Dorchester county deceased, which was read dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to incorporate the Maryland chymical works; was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to regulate the issuing of licenses to the keepers of ordinaries and retailers of spirituous liquors, the same being the order of the day was read a third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act, relative to persons whose title to freedom accrues hereafter, was read a second time and on motion of Mr. Nelson the question was put, shall the said bill be indefinitely postponed, the yeas and nays, being required, appeared as follows.
