

The bill entitled, an act to pay the civil list, and other expenses of civil government, was read the second time, and laid on the table.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee on ways and means, reported favourably on the resolution relative to the settlement of the accounts of the late states agent for the western shore. The said resolution was then read the second time and laid on the table.

Mr. Heath, from the committee to whom was referred, the bill entitled, an act to appoint inspectors of salted pork and beef in this state, reported unfavourably on the same.—The bill was then read the second and third time, by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Chatsworth Canal company of Baltimore, was read the second and third time, by special order rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to whom was referred the same, reported favourably upon the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Vulcan Furnace company of Baltimore, the bill was then read the second and third time by special order, when on motion the following amendment was proposed and adopted.—“In second line of 9th section, strike out 65, and insert 45, the question was then put, shall the bill pass.”—Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson from the committee to whom was referred, “the bill entitled, an act relative to acknowledging and recording deeds, and to examining femes covert as to their free assent to the same,” reported unfavourable thereon.—The bill was then read the second and third time, by special order, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session in the year 1805, chapter one hundred, was read the third time, when on motion the following amendment was proposed and adopted. Be it further enacted, that the second section of the act entitled, an act relating to insolvent debtors, chapter two hundred and five, passed December session eighteen hundred and twenty-five, be and the same is hereby repealed, and on motion the question was put, ‘will the senate strike out all the sections of the bill, except the last.’
