

By the Senate, March 12th, 1827.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message announcing the appointment of a committee to invite the governor to attend in the senate chamber to-morrow at 10 o'clock, for the purpose of signing and sealing the laws;—we concur in the change of the hour on the part of the senate. Messrs. Forrest and Johnson are appointed a committee.

The clerk of the house delivered a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and sixteen, chap 78, which being read, Mr. Forrest offered the following as an amendment;—Strike out the word 'ten' in the last line of the bill, and insert the word 'five,' which was read, and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Forrest, the question was put 'will the senate amend the bill by inserting at the end of the same, the following proviso.'

Provided, that the said lotteries shall be drawn under the direction and controul of the lottery commissioners, and the tickets shall be disposed of and the lotteries drawn in all respects in conformity to the regulations prescribed by law for the drawing of state lotteries.

On motion, the further consideration of the said bill was postponed until to-morrow.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill to explain the law in relation to clandestine removals to avoid distress for rent, which was read the first time, and laid on the table.

The resolution relative to the printing of the laws, passed at the present session, was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.
