Determined in the affirmative, so the bill was passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to enable the trustees of county and other schools and academies to recover and obtain possession of the funds and other property and effects belonging to such schools and academies, was twice read, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution to delay execution on certain judgements of the state against the representatives of John Nicholson, late of Anne Arundel county, which was read, amended, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Amendment proposed.

Insert at the end of the resolution; 'provided, that the said represent 'ives shall derive no benefit from this resolution, unless they enter in a bond in such penal sum as the orphan's court of Anne Arundel shall direct, and with such security as they shall approve, conditioned to pay whatever is due on said judgement by the estate of said John Nicholson.

Also, a resolution for the compensation of Gideon Pearce, for the performance of the duty prescribed by a resolution of the general assembly, passed at December session 1825, in preparing a system in relation to officers fees, which was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, a bill entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Maryland Hospital, which was read the first and by special order a second and third time:

Mr. Johnson offered the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

At the end of the bill, insert the following as an additional section.—'And be it enacted, That the governor and council shall not be authorised to proceed under this act, unless they are fully satisfied that the entire right, title, interest in, and claim to the said property, is at the date of the conveyance, provided by this act, vested in the said Mayor and city council of Baltimore.

The question was then put, 'shall the said bill pass?'
The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows.
