

The bill to empower William Wailes, to appeal from the decision of the levy court of said county relative to a certain road, was read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to a polar expedition, was read the third time, and the question put, will the senate assent to the same. The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

The bill requiring commissioners of lotteries to give bond, was passed, as amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution requiring the treasurer to withhold payment under the act of December session, 1824, chapter 125. during the continuance of the present session, of assembly, was read, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The further supplement to the act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, passed at December session, 1816, chapter 78, was read a third time, and the question was put 'shall the bill pass?' The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:
