

Determined in the negative, and it was returned to the house of delegates.

The report and resolution submitted by the committee of the house of delegates, to whom was referred, the communication of the honourable John Compton Weems, to the president of the senate, and speaker of the house of delegates, relative to the establishment of a naval academy, was read, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution in favour of Unity Gallagher, of Cecil county, was read, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Johnson, from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the bill to assign and appropriate certain revenues for the support of public instruction in primary schools, of all the youth throughout this state, and the additional supplement to the act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools through this state.—The said bills were then read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The resolution requesting the executive to cause an exposition of the laws of public instruction to be prepared and printed, was read, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to repeal an act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehannah at Havre de Grace, was read the third time, and the question was put 'shall the bill pass?'

The further supplement to the act to provide a summary mode of recovering possession of lands and tenements holden by tenants for years or at will, after the expiration of their terms, was read a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the contemplated bridge over the river Susquehannah, at Conowingo creek, to the Pennsylvania line, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.
